

## PROGRAM DETAILS

Day 1: Thu, Feb 13 Leave USA

We will leave USA for Jedda, Saudi Arabia.

Day 2: Fri, Feb 14 Jeddah


We will arrive in Jeddah late at night.

We will have a good night's rest at our hotel to get ready for the next day.

#### Overnight in Jeddah

**Jeddah** was once a port city living mostly off the pilgrim trade of Mecca, serving as Mecca's outlet to the sea. It was always an important stop on the caravan route from Yemen to Egypt and Syria, and a local center of pilgrimage for the tribes from the surrounding deserts.

The spread of Islam made the holy city a religious center for people from all over the world, many of whom arrived by sea. Islam soon transformed Jeddah into a thriving metropolis in its own right. Over the years, it has become one of the Arab world's most important commercial centers while remaining the principal port of entry for more than two million pilgrims who make their way to the holy city of Mecca each year.



### Day 3: Sat, Feb 15 Jeddah

Enjoy a morning walking tour through old Jeddah with its unique, centuries-old, multi- storied white urban dwellings. The wooden ornamentation on the sides of these houses has been designed to let in the sea breezes and at the same time shield residents, particularly females, from the eyes of passers-by. Our expert guide will walk us in the maze of the old city and tell us about Hejazi architecture which has been described as a melting pot of several forms of Islamic design. End the morning with a chance to wander through Jeddah's many souks.

After lunch at a local restaurant, we will visit one of the old merchant houses to see the way of life in the 19th and 20th centuries. We will have tea or coffee in one of the traditional houses that was converted into a tea house. We may have a chance to socialize with local families. Continue on to the Al Tayebat private museum, housed in a restored complex of traditional buildings. The museum has several floors of in-depth exhibits covering history and cultural heritage of Arabian peninsula, Saudi Arabia and Islam.

Return to the hotel passing by more modern parts of the city, including the Corniche which runs for 45 miles along the Red Sea. There are about 400 outdoor sculptures in and around the corniche.

We will enjoy a lovely dinner this evening at a nice local restaurant frequented by Jeddah families.

### Day 4: Sun, Feb 16 Jeddah - AlUla

Early in the morning we will take the domestic flight from Jeddah to AlUla. After having lunch, we will start our program visiting AlUla old town.

Overnight in AlUla Breakfast: B-L-D

**AlUla Old Town,** a captivating gem in Saudi Arabia, offers a rich tapestry of history and culture. This ancient settlement, which dates back to the 12th century, boasts a maze of narrow, winding streets lined with over 800 mudbrick houses, shops, and courtyards.

Once a vital stop on the incense trade route, AlUla Old Town thrived as a bustling hub for merchants and travelers.

Today, visitors can wander through its evocative ruins, imagining the vibrant life that once pulsed through its alleys. The town's historic mosques and market squares provide a fascinating glimpse into the architectural and cultural heritage of the region.

We will start our program in the region early in the morning.

First we will proceed to visit the historic site of Mada'in Saleh. Then we will continue with Hejaz railway station No. 21, from pre-First World War era and Maraya, first from outside, then for a special dinner..

We will also have an off-road excursion, by 4x4s, into the desert and canyon formations.

Overnight in Al Ula Breakfast: B-L-D

**Mada'in Saleh** is an archaeological site located in the area of Al Ula within Medina Province in the Hejaz. A majority of the remains date from the Nabataean Kingdom (1st century AD). The site constitutes the kingdom's southernmost settlement and its second largest city after Petra (now in Jordan), its capital city.

The Hejaz railway was a narrow-gauge railway that ran from Damascus to Medina, through the Hejaz region of modern day Saudi Arabia, with a branch line to Haifa on the Mediterranean Sea. It was a part of the Ottoman railway network and the original goal was to extend the line from the Haydarpaşa Terminal in Istanbul beyond Damascus to the holy city of Mecca. However, construction was interrupted due to the outbreak of World War I, and it reached up to Medina, 400 kilometers (250 mi) short of Mecca. The completed Damascus to Medina section was 1,300 kilometers (810 mi).

The Hejaz line was repeatedly attacked and damaged, particularly during the Arab Revolt, when Ottoman trains were ambushed by the guerrilla force led by T. E. Lawrence.

Maraya is an architectural wonder that has quickly reached icon status. Upon approaching this magnificent mirrored structure in AlUla's Ashar Valley you may feel your eyes are deceiving you as Maraya seems to disappear into the surrounding sandstone cliffs before swiftly reappearing. A multi-purpose venue for concerts, events and conferences, Maraya — meaning 'mirror' in Arabic — is the largest mirrored building in the world and is a piece of art in itself.



#### Day 6: Tue, Feb 18 Riyadh

Early in the morning we will fly from AlUla to Riyadh.

Upon arrival, we will have lunch.

Afternoon program details will be available as the trip date gets closer.

### Day 7: Wed, Feb 19 Riyadh

We will begin at the archaeological site of Diriyyah, whose zenith as capital of most of Arabia came during the reign of Saud the Great who ruled here from 1802 to 1814. What remains of Diriyyah today is remarkably extensive and evocative of traditional settled life in the region. The most impressive ruins are those of Turaif on the north bank. The sparser ruins of Ghasibah on the south bank are older, possibly dating back to the city's foundation in the 15th century. After lunch at a traditional local restaurant with floor seating, we will visit the city center, spend time in the National Museum with its sweeping, curved wall and Najd architectural design. The museum's eight galleries trace Saudi Arabia's history. Then we will continue on to the Murabba Palace which has been renovated to reflect the architecture of the original structure.

Overnight in Riyadh Breakfast: B-L-D

**Riyadh,** Saudi Arabia's capital and main financial hub, is on a desert plateau in the country's center. Business district landmarks include the 302m-high Kingdom Centre, with a sky bridge connecting 2 towers, and 267m-high Al Faisaliah Centre, with a glass-globe summit. The the city center, an area of largely restored, rebuilt and renovated buildings constructed in classic Arabian style. It includes the original area of Riyadh – the enclave fought for by Ibn Saud – which is now the centerpiece of imaginative and extensive redevelopment. The symbolic entrance to this area is the Al Thumairi Gate, a reconstruction of one of the entrances to Riyadh when the city was surrounded by old mud walls.

**Kingdom Center** is a 41-story, 302.3 m (992 ft) skyscraper in Riyadh. When completed in 2002, it overtook the 267-meter (876 ft) Faisaliyah Tower as the tallest tower in Saudi Arabia. It has since been surpassed and, as of 2021, is the fifth-tallest skyscraper in the country.

There is a 65m skybridge atop the skyscraper.

### Day 8: Thu, Feb 20 Riyadh

Another full day in Riyadh.

We will continue our sightseeing program with Kingdom Center.

Then we will continue to the Al Masmak Fort, the oldest complete building in Riyadh. (Al Masmak Fort is under renovation at the moment. If renovation is not completed by the time we are in Riyadh, can see the fort only from outside.) We will also spend some time at the Derah Heritage Souq around the fort.

Late afternoon, we can visit a local art gallery to see examples of Saudi artists' works.
